- **compromise** (verb or noun) – reaching an agreement with someone
- **immoral** (adj.) – the opposite of what is considered to be moral; going against what is right, good, and honest.
- **industrial economy** – when a nation relies heavily on the manufacturing and production of goods
- **agrarian society** – when a community's economy is based on the production of plants, crops, and farmland
- **abolition** (noun) – the act of ending a system, practice or institution (such as slavery)
  - abolish (verb)
- **secede** (verb) – withdraw or leave from a federal union or political organization
  - secession (noun)
- **sea fort** (noun) – a fort completely surrounded by water
- **galvanize** (verb) – to motivate or inspire someone or a group of people to action
- **conscripted** (verb) – to be forced into service either for the military or another group
- **preserve** (verb) – to keep, care for, or maintain
  - preservation (noun)
- **Emancipation Proclamation of 1863** (noun) – issued by President Abraham Lincoln, it declared that all slaves in the Confederate states were free
- **blockades** (noun) – a design that prevents the flow of something
- **unification** (noun) – the process of bringing together into a group or a whole
- **justify** (verb) – to show or prove to be right or reasonable
- **subjugation** (noun) – the act of bringing someone or something under control or domination
- **infringe** (verb) – to damage or weaken
