- compromise (verb or noun) reaching an agreement with someone

- **abolition** (noun) the act of ending a system, practice or institution (such as slavery)

- galvanize (verb) to motivate or inspire someone or a group of people to action
- conscripted (verb) to be forced into service either for the military or another group

  - preservation (noun)
- Emancipation Proclamation of 1863 (noun) issued by President Abraham Lincoln, it declared that all slaves in the Confederate states were free
- blockades (noun) a design that prevents the flow of something
- unification (noun) the process of bringing together into a group or a whole
- **justify** (verb) to show or prove to be right or reasonable
- subjugation (noun) the act of bringing someone or something under control or domination
- infringe (verb) to damage or weaken
