KEY TERMS

- **regiment** (noun) – a permanent unit of an army commanded by a colonel or captain that can be divided into several companies
- **reformer** (noun) – a person who wants to make changes to something
- **First Confiscation Act** – It was passed on August 6, 1861 and allowed the Union army to take over Confederate property and free enslaved people from having to work for the Confederate military.
- **Emancipation Proclamation** – issued by President Abraham Lincoln, it declared that all slaves in the Confederate states were free and allowed Black men to enlist in military service
- **veteran** (noun) – a person who fought in war
- **pension** (noun) – a monthly payment
