## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- In the 1950's, the U.S. government began to offer money to any American Indian person who would leave their reservation and move to a U.S. city so many American Indians lived in urban areas. The American Indian Movement was created in response to the challenges of living in cities.
  - a. Considering what you've learned, do you think they were better off staying on the reservations or moving to the cities? Why?
  - b. Can you think of an alternative plan that would have been fair for American Indian people?
- 2. The Occupation of Alcatraz was a non-violent protest.
  - a. Why do you think they chose to protest peacefully?
    - i. Would you have chosen a different way to protest?
      - 1. Why or why not?
- 3. The Occupation of Alcatraz and the Occupation of Wounded Knee both occurred at places that represent past times of White violence against American Indians. Both occupations are related to a long chain of events, not just a single problem. It has been difficult for American Indians to achieve justice and peace when the U.S. government has such a long history of aggression.
  - a. Given the history of pain and mistrust, name two elements that would have to be present in a peace agreement between American Indians and the U.S. government. Explain
- 4. The 1976 Senate Judiciary Committee Report claims that the American Indian Movement (AIM) is "committed to violence."
  - a. What do you think the Senators were trying to gain when making these false claims?
  - b. Who do you imagine they are appealing to, and why?
  - c. Consider the perspective of an American Indian person. How do you think they would respond to the report?
