## **KEY TERMS**

- Indian Reservation (noun) land that is managed by a federally recognized American Page | 1 Indian tribe under the U.S. Bureau of Indian Affairs.
- treaty (noun) -- a formal agreement between two groups, armies, or nations.
- **assimilate** (verb) to become absorbed into a larger culture. To fit in, people change their language, clothing, religion, and other cultural behaviors. Sometimes assimilation is a choice, and sometimes it is forced.
- Indian termination policy (noun) Policy during the 1940s-1960s intended to end the federal government's relationship with Native American Tribes. The legislation ended tribal sovereignty, a tribe's ability to govern itself, and become subject to state and federal laws.
- confiscate (verb) to take or seize without authority
- appropriate (verb) to take something for one's own use
- sterilization (noun) a surgery that makes someone unable to give birth
- genocide (noun) mass killing of a group of people
- matriarchy (noun) a society or government ruled by women
- patriarchy (noun) a society or government ruled by women
- Wounded Knee massacre (noun) an 1890 massacre where U.S. troops killed 150-300 Native Americans in South Dakota
- Watergate scandal (noun) a political scandal during the early 1970's that led to the resignation of President Richard Nixon
- sarcasm (noun) using sharp expressions or irony to mock and show contempt
- ecology (noun) the study of how living organisms interact with one another
- plight (noun) a dangerous or unfortunate situation

- suasion (noun) the act of influencing or persuading
- solicit (noun) to ask or to try to obtain something from someone
- deferential (adjective) showing humility or respect
- obsequious (adjective) obedient and attentive in a way that is not genuine
