Background Information

Ali's involvement in social justice issues organically occurred. He descended from a long line of family members dedicated to social justice and civil rights issues.¹ His dad focused on workers' rights and expected his children to be involved in activism.¹¹ Ali developed an interest in environmental justice. At 16, he joined Environmental Careers Organization (ECO), an Environmental Protection Agency program that specifically focused on minority students gaining experience in environmental activism.¹¹¹

Ali's Resistance

During Ali's time at the Environmental Careers Organization, he was a founding member of the EPA's Office of Environmental Justice. He remained at the organization for 24 years.^{iv} Ali focused on creating programs that prevented or alleviated the toxic pollution load in Black, Indigenous, and low-income communities.^v Ali joined and worked at organizations focused on environmental justice issues. He also shared his ecological expertise with professors and the Hip Hop Caucus senior vice president.^{vi} Ali's environmental justice field experiences focused on the voices of marginalized communities. Ali used community-based research rather than approaches that solely centered on Western scientific knowledge.^{vii} Mustafa Ali's work as a national speaker, policymaker, and facilitator focused on educating communities worldwide about environmental justice.

Achievements

Ali's work highlighted how making environmental justice knowledge accessible is crucial for political participation in the most impacted communities.^{viii} Most importantly, Ali stressed using holistic approaches besides Western empirical knowledge to revitalize historically marginalized and excluded communities.
